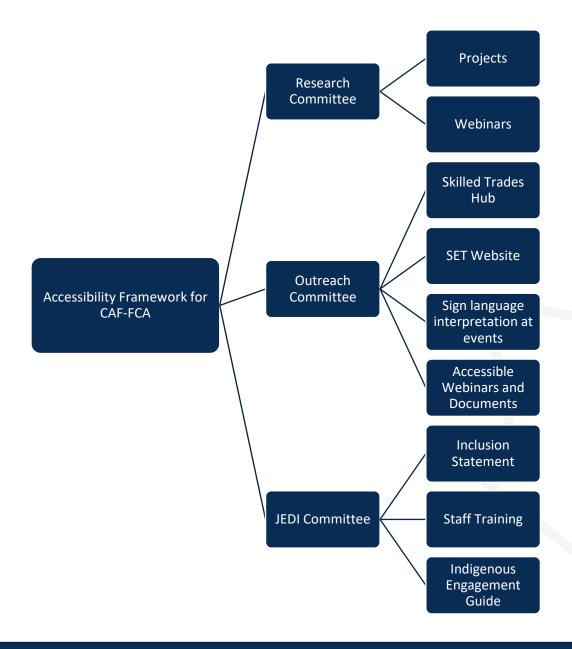
Impact

- Trade Focus: All trades

- Partners: National Education Association of Disabled Students (NEADS)
- Key Activities:
 - 60 stakeholders engaged
 - Guide written
 - 3 webinars planned (ODEN, NEADS, and WSPS)
 - 1 NEADS event
- Current Status: Guide created and webinars being hosted.

CCRW Project

- Trade Focus: All trades
- Province: National focus
- Partners: Canadian Council for Rehabilitation and Work (CCRW)
- Key Activities:
 - Staff training related to accessible events
 - Funding for ALS and translation for any virtual elements at our conferences
 - Discussion Session at SETT 2025
 - 3 vignettes with key messages about supporting persons with disabilities
 - 5 regional events
 - 10 infographics
 - 20 social media posts
 - 5 one pager
 - 5 webinars
- Current Status: 5 webinars and 5 events planned (College of North Atlantic, BCIT, VCC, St Lawrence and Fanshawe)



Irving Shipbuilding and Unifor Project

- Trade focus: Welder, Metal Fabricator, Industrial Electrician, Steamfitter/Pipefitter, Industrial Mechanic (Millwright), Plumber and Machinist
- Partners: Irving and Unifor
- Key Activities:
 - Apprentices have access to Skills Coaches who are monitoring logbooks and progression.
 - Apprentices have access to Learning Strategists, assessments and learning supports. Early intervention and preparation it is hoped will result in increased pass rates.
- Current Status: Apprentice assessment underway.



Improving Pass Rates for Apprentices

- Trades focus: Heavy Equipment and Mobile Crane Operators
- Partners: IUOE and SkillPlan
- Key Activities:
 - Access to online resource to help with learning and preparing for the Red Seal exam
 - 900 plus IUOE apprentices using the tool
- Current Status: Full Pilot Launch

 - Webinar series starts in September (target is 7 webinars)

Promoting Careers in the Skilled Trades

Trades Focus: All trades

Province: Alberta

Partners: Apprenticesearch.com

Key Activities:

- CAF-FCA hosted 13 workshops with 686 newcomers.
- To engage high school students across Alberta, CAF-FCA is using Chatter High (online resource used at high schools) to ask students CAF-FCA approved questions about apprenticeship and to engage students in learning about CAF-FCA resources.
- CAF-FCA and Apprenticesearch.com are working together to plan the remaining 5 workshops.
- Current Status: Events planned for September 23rd, 25th and October 25th.



Skills for Success

- Trade focus: All trades
- Partners: United for Literacy
- Key Results:
 - 77 consultations with Indigenous tradespeople and apprenticeship stakeholders in every region in Canada, including Nunavut, were conducted.
 - Co-developed Framework and report with the Project Advisory Committee
- Current Status: The report is on the CAF-FCA website. An event is being planned for October 23rd at Algonquin College. Indigenous tradespeople have been invited to be on a panel to share their apprenticeship journeys.
